

COUNTY COMMISSIONER

Qualifications

1. Must have been a resident of the county in which seeking the office for at least 12 months prior to election or appointment.

O.C.G.A. §§ 45-2-1, 21-2-6

Annotations:

- i. The residency requirement refers to domicile. There must be either the tacit or explicit intention to change one's domicile before one can change his legal residence. If a person leaves the place of his domicile temporarily, or for a particular purpose, and does not take up an actual residence elsewhere with the avowed intention of making a change in his domicile, he will not be considered as having changed his domicile. Haggard v. Graham, 142 Ga. App. 498, 236 S.E.2d 92 (1977).*
 - ii. A candidate for office of county commissioner must be a resident for a period of months prior to his or her election but does not have to reside in the commission district from which he or she seeks election for that period. Op. Atty. Gen. 86-23.*
 - iii. A county is not authorized to establish more stringent residency requirements for election of county commissioners than the requirements in the O.C.G.A. Op. Atty. Gen. 97-27.*
2. Must be a qualified voter.

O.C.G.A. § 21-2-6

3. Must affirm during the candidate qualifying period the requirement to complete all mandatory training if elected, as required for county governing authority or local board of education members.

O.C.G.A. § 21-5-50 (a) (3.2)

4. Must be a citizen of the state and must have attained the age of 21 years; provided, however, that upon passage of appropriate local ordinances, citizens of the state who are otherwise qualified and are at least 18 years of age shall be eligible to hold any county office, except offices of a judicial nature.

Term of Office and Election

5. Elected by qualified voters of the county.
6. Term of office is four years.

7. Elected in the general election held on the Tuesday following the first Monday in November in the year preceding the expiration of the term of office.

See Ga. Const. Art. 9, § 1, and local legislation enacted for individual counties.

8. A candidate for county commissioner must pay a qualification fee or file a pauper's affidavit.

O.C.G.A. §§ 21-2-131, 21-2-132, 21-2-153

Annotations:

- i. *If a candidate is unable to pay required qualifying fee, candidate may execute a pauper's affidavit in lieu of qualifying fee and be afforded the opportunity to run. Op. Atty. Gen. 72-48. See Georgia Socialist Workers Party v. Fortson, 315 F. Supp. 1035 (N.D. Ga 1970).*
- ii. *A candidate for the final half of an unexpired term must pay the full qualification fee just as if he or she were running for a full term. Op. Atty. Gen. U70-77.*
- iii. *For the purpose of computing qualifying fee, only the salary which the law provides for the office directly involved should be included and not the additional compensation paid for the ex-officio position held by the incumbent. Op. Atty. Gen. 70-53.*
- iv. *An elected official cannot rely on payment of an incorrectly advertised qualifying fee to compel the governing authority to compensate the elected official beyond the salary permitted by statute. Rowland v. Tattnall County, 260 Ga. 109, 390 S.E. 2d 217 (1990).*

9. Eligibility of write-in candidate:

- a) No person shall be eligible as a write-in candidate in a special or general primary, a special or general primary runoff, or in a special or general election runoff.
- b) No person shall be eligible as a write-in candidate in a general or special election if such person was a candidate for nomination or election to the same office in the immediately preceding primary.
- c) No person elected on a write-in vote shall be eligible to hold office unless notice of his or her intention of candidacy was filed and published no earlier than January 1 and no later than the Tuesday after the first Monday in September prior to the election in the case of a general election or at least 20 or more days prior to a special election. In a general or special election of county officers,
 - i. notice must be filed with the superintendent of elections in the county in which the person is to be a candidate and published in the official organ of the same county by the person giving notice of intention to be a write-in candidate or by some other person or group of persons qualified to vote in the subject election; and
 - ii. a copy of the notice as published and an affidavit that the notice has been published, including the name of the newspaper and the date of publication, must be filed with the superintendent of elections not later than the fifth day after the deadline for filing and publishing such notice.

10. No person shall be nominated, nor shall any person be a candidate in a primary, election, or special election for more than one of the following public offices to be filled at any one election or special election: Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, Attorney General, State School Superintendent, Commissioner of Insurance, Commissioner of Agriculture, Commissioner of Labor, United States Senator or Representative in Congress, Public Service Commissioner, Justice of the Supreme Court, Judge of the Court of Appeals, members of the Senate and House of Representatives of the General Assembly, judge of superior court, district attorney, any elected county officer, and any elected municipal officer.

11. No person shall be nominated or elected who has been adjudged a "subversive person," as defined in the Sedition and Subversive Activities Act of 1953.

O.C.G.A. § 21-2-7

Oath of Office

12. Every public officer must take the oath of office and any oath prescribed by the Constitution of Georgia and must swear that he or she
 - a) is not the holder of any unaccounted for public money due this state;
 - b) is not the holder of any office of trust under the government of the United States, any other state, or any foreign state which he or she is by the laws of the State of Georgia prohibited from holding;
 - c) is otherwise qualified to hold said office according to the constitution and laws of Georgia; and
 - d) will support the constitutions of the United States and of this state.

O.C.G.A. § 45-3-1

Note:

The official acts of an officer are valid regardless of his or her omission to take and file the oath, except in cases where so specially declared. See O.C.G.A. § 45-3-10.

Cross-Reference:

Any public officer who willfully and intentionally violates the terms of his or her oath as prescribed by law shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by imprisonment for not less than one nor more than five years. O.C.G.A. § 16 -10-1.

13. A loyalty oath, which must state that such person will support the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of Georgia and is not a member of the Communist Party, is also required for all elected officers of this state.

Annotations:

- i. *See Georgia Conference of Am. Ass'n. of University Professors v. Bd. of Regents of University System of Ga., 246 F. Supp. 553 (N.D. Ga. 1965), limiting the coverage of the loyalty oath.*
- ii. *The portion of the Georgia loyalty oath which requires one to swear to support the constitutions of Georgia and the United States is valid, and that portion of the oath which requires disavowal of membership in the Communist Party is unconstitutional and should not be administered. Op. Atty. Gen. 85-19.*

Vacancies in and Succession to Office

14. When a vacancy occurs in the office of a county governing authority in any county in which the local act creating that governing authority for the county makes no provision for succession to fill the vacancy and the unexpired term of office exceeds six months in duration, it shall be the duty of the judge of the probate court of the county to call a special election to elect a successor and fill the vacancy in not less than 30 nor more than 60 days. The election shall be held as provided by Chapter 2 of Title 21, the Georgia Election Code, and the cost of the election shall be defrayed by the proper county authorities. If the unexpired term to be filled is less than six months in duration and the local act creating the governing authority makes no provision to fill the vacancy, the judge of the superior court of the county shall have the power to appoint a successor to fill the unexpired term.

Note:

See O.C.G.A. § 36-5-21(b) and (c) concerning simultaneous vacancies in all commissioner offices or a vacancy in the office of sole commissioner.

Annotation:

The general law is not applicable if the local act creating the governing authority for the county provides for the manner of succession to fill the vacancy. Op. Atty. Gen. U90-9.

General Disqualifications

15. The following persons are ineligible to hold any civil office, and the existence of any of the following acts shall be a sufficient reason for vacating any office held by such person, but the acts of such person, while holding a commission, shall be valid as the acts of an officer de facto, namely:
 - a) Persons who are not citizens of this state and persons under the age of 21 years, provided, however, that upon passage of appropriate ordinances, citizens of this state who are otherwise qualified and who are 18 years old shall be eligible to hold any county or municipal office, other than a judicial office.
 - b) Persons who are the holders of public funds who have refused or failed to account for and pay over such funds to the proper officer.
 - c) Persons holding any office of profit or trust under the government of the United States other than that of postmaster and officers and enlisted persons of the armed forces. Membership on any federal commission, panel, or other fact-finding or policy-making agency, where the appointment is temporary and the duties do not interfere materially with the person's duties as a public officer, shall not bar any person from holding office in this state or acceding to a state office.
 - d) Persons of unsound mind and persons who, from advanced age or bodily infirmity, are unfit to discharge the duties of the office to which they are chosen or appointed.
 - e) Persons who are not registered and qualified voters entitled to vote.
 - f) Persons who have been convicted of a felony involving moral turpitude, unless that person's civil rights have been restored and at least 10 years have elapsed from the date of the completion of the sentence without a subsequent conviction of another felony involving moral turpitude.
 - g) Persons who have been convicted and sentenced in any court of competent jurisdiction for fraudulent violation of primary or election laws or malfeasance in office unless such person's civil rights have been restored.
 - h) Persons who are constitutionally disqualified for any cause.

Cross-Reference:

"Public office" means every federal, state, county, and municipal office to which persons can be elected by a vote of the electors under the laws of this state or under the respective municipal charters, except the office of soil and water conservation officer. O.C.G.A. § 21-2-2 (30).

Note:

Each candidate is required to file an affidavit which states that he or she is eligible to hold the office for which he or she is running. See O.C.G.A. §§ 21-2-132 (e), 21-2-153 (e).

Annotations:

- i. *To prevent persons convicted of certain crimes from holding office, the “conviction” must be a final one. There is no “conviction” within the constitutional provision if jury’s verdict has been set aside or is under review and thus subject to be set aside either by motion for new trial, bill of exceptions, or other appropriate procedures. Summerour v. Cartrett, 220 Ga. 31, 136 S.E.2d 724 (1964).*
- ii. *While pardon restores a person to full rights of citizenship, including the right to hold office, it does not operate to confer or restore public office previously held. Morris v. Hartsfield, 186 Ga. 171, 197 S.E. 251 (1938).*
- iii. *A convicted felon who has had his or her civil rights restored is eligible to vote and hold public office. Op. Atty. Gen. U77-43.*
- iv. *The conviction of the crime of “having liquor” does not render a person disqualified from holding public office if at the time of commission such crime carried only misdemeanor punishment. Op. Atty. Gen. 67-26.*
- v. *Examples of crimes which always involve moral turpitude were pointed out in Johnson v. Riley, 13 Ga. 97, 131(2) (1853); Holloway v. Holloway, 126 Ga. 459, 460 (1), 55 S.E. 191 (1906) (murder); Ng Sui Wing v. United States, 46 F.2d 755 (7th Cir. 1931) (statutory rape); United States ex rel. Volpe v. Smith, 289 U.S. 422 (1933) (counterfeiting); United States ex rel. Karpay v. Uhl, 70 F.2d 792 (2d Cir. 1934) (perjury); United States ex rel. Cerami v. Uhl, 78 F.2d 698 (2d Cir. 1935) (robbery); In re King, 165 Ore. 103, 105 P.2d 870 (1940) (false swearing); In re Sutton, 213 Minn. 76, 5 N.W.2d 396 (1942) (embezzlement); Evans v. State, 70 Ga. App. 500, 501(3), 28 S.E. 2d 671 (1944) (soliciting for prostitutes); Thompson v. State, 72 Ga. App. 852, cert. denied, 329 U.S. 714 (1946) (cheating and swindling); Bancroft v. Board of Governors of Registered Dentists of Oklahoma, 202 Okla. 108, 210 P.2d 666 (1949) (issuing checks without sufficient funds with intent to defraud); Librarian v. State Bar, 38 Cal.2d 328, 239 P.2d 865, 866(2) (1952) (extortion); United States ex rel. Abbenante v. Butterfield, 112 F. Supp. 324, 326(2) (E.D. Mich. 1953) (forgery); State ex rel. Ricco v. Biggs, 198 Ore. 413, 255 P.2d 1055 (1953) (keeping a bawdy-house); Huff v. Anderson, 212 Ga. 32, 90 S.E.2d 329 (1955) (presenting fraudulent claims against the government); Matter of Brooks, 263 Ga. 530, 436 S.E.2d 493 (1993) (sexual battery); and Rehnberger v. State, 1998 WL 69072 (false imprisonment). However, moral turpitude was found not to be involved in the following crimes: Curry v. State, 17 Ga. App. 312, 86 S.E. 742 (1915) (fighting); United States ex rel. Andreacchi v. Curran, 38 F.2d 498 (S.D.N.Y. 1926) (carrying a concealed weapon); Groves v. State, 175 Ga. 37, 164 S.E. 822 (1932) (driving a vehicle on a public road while in an intoxicated state); Wyatt v. Cerf, 64 Cal. App. 2d 732, 149 P.2d 309 (1944) (disturbing the peace); Duke v. Meyers, 86 Ga. App. 271, 71 S.E.2d 297 (1952) (unlawfully selling intoxicating liquor). 1963-65 Op. Atty. Gen. p. 115, Op. Atty. Gen. 76-69. Other crimes not involving moral turpitude include Seaboard Coastline R. Co. v. West, 155 Ga. App. 391, 271 S.E.2d 36 (1980) (child abandonment); Mingo v. State, 195 Ga. App. 438, 394 S.E.2d 104 (1990) (writing bad checks); Hall v. Hall, 261 Ga. 188, 402 S.E.2d 726 (1991) (DUI misdemeanor conviction); and Barker v. State, 211 Ga. App. 279, 254 S.E.2d 850 (1993) (misdemeanor criminal trespass).*
- vi. *Any citizen and taxpayer of a community or the state may challenge qualifications of public officials to hold office in that community or the state. Such a person has standing to bring a quo warranto action claiming that a public official is ineligible to hold the office. Highsmith v. Clark 245 Ga. 158, 264 S.E.2d 1 (1980).*
- vii. *A potential candidate who completed his sentence for conviction of a felony prior to the enactment of the 1990 amendment to this paragraph did not have any vested rights to seek office. Constitutional amendment prescribing ineligibility to hold office for 10 years after*

the completion of the sentence applies retroactively. Eligibility to hold public office is determined by the statutory and constitutional requirements in effect on the date of election. McIntyre v. Miller, 236 Ga. 578, 436 S.E.2d 2 (1993).

- viii. *The 1990 constitutional amendment requiring that potential candidates fulfil a 10-year waiting period following completion of a sentence for conviction of a felony involving moral turpitude does not violate the principal of double jeopardy. McIntyre v. Miller, 236 Ga. 578, 436 S.E.2d 2 (1993).*
- ix. *The 1990 constitutional amendment does not preempt the enforcement of other qualifications for office that may provide for the temporary suspension from office where no felony conviction exists. Eaves v. Harris, 258 Ga. 1, 364 S.E.2d 854 (1988).*
- x. *An indictment alone would not disqualify a person as a candidate for public office. Op. Atty. Gen. U68-102.*
- xi. *Where a potential candidate has been convicted of a felony involving moral turpitude, pardon or restoration of civil rights is necessary to hold any office or appointment of honor or trust even if the sentence has been completed. Op. Atty. 83-33.*
- xii. *A person seeking to hold any office or appointment of honor and trust in this state must meet the eligibility requirements as set forth in Ga. Const. Art. 2, § 2, ¶ 3, as amended by the 1990 amendment. Op. Atty. Gen. 92-3.*
- xiii. *A candidate who registers to vote only after his or her qualification for office and the closing of the qualifications process is not legally qualified to run for office. Op. Atty. Gen. U92-14.*

16. Suspension and removal from office upon felony indictment or conviction:

- a) Upon indictment for a felony by a grand jury of this state, which felony relates to the performance or activities of the indicted official, state law provides a means by which such official may be suspended, with pay, pending the final disposition of the case or until the expiration of the official's term of office, whichever occurs first.
- b) Upon initial conviction for any felony in a trial court of this state or the United States, the convicted official shall be immediately and without further action suspended from office without pay.
- c) Upon final conviction of a felony, the office shall be vacated immediately without further action. Said vacancy shall be filled in the manner provided by law for filling vacancies in such office caused by death or resignation.

Annotation:

Suspension of a county commission according to O.C.G.A. § 45-5-6 and O.C.G.A. § 45-5-6.1 without giving the commissioner the opportunity to challenge the validity of the charges in the indictment did not deprive the commissioner of procedural due process and did not deprive voters of any constitutional rights. Eaves v. Harris, 258 Ga. 1; 364 S.E. 2d 854.

17. No person shall hold, in any manner whatever, at one time, more than one county office, except by special enactment of the legislature.

HOW A CANDIDATE'S NAME SHALL APPEAR ON THE BALLOT

The rules regarding how a candidate's name shall appear on the ballot are set out in Georgia State Election Board (SEB) Rule 183-1-11-.02.

The SEB rule specifies that:

1. The candidate's name on the ballot has to contain the last name as it appears on their voter registration record and at least one of the following:
 - a. The first name (or initial with period) as it appears on their voter registration record;
 - i. **EXAMPLE: JONATHAN DOE or J. DOE**
 - b. The middle name (or initial with period) as it appears on their voter registration record;
 - i. **EXAMPLE: WILLIAM DOE or W. DOE**
 - c. An abbreviated first name by which the candidate is commonly known; or
 - i. **EXAMPLE: JOHN DOE**
 - d. A nickname by which the candidate is commonly known.
 - i. **EXAMPLE: BUDDY DOE**
 - ii. **EXAMPLE: JONATHAN "BUDDY" DOE**
2. As mentioned above, a candidate's name on the ballot may include a nickname by which the candidate is commonly known, but cannot contain any titles referring to the business, fraternal, religious, or professional affiliation of the candidate, or political slogan or message. A title or degree includes, but is not limited to, military or professional title or rank, or references such as "Dr.", "Rev.", "Judge", "Mr.", "Ms.", "Mrs.", or "Miss."
 - i. **EXAMPLES:**
 1. **Acceptable: BUDDY DOE**
 2. **Acceptable: JOHN "BUDDY" DOE**
 3. **In violation: DR. JOHN DOE; MR. JOHN DOE**
 4. **In violation: JOHN "VOTE FOR ME" DOE**
 5. **In violation: JONATHAN DOE ESQ.**
 6. **In violation: CAPT. JONATHAN DOE**
3. The candidate's name cannot be longer than 25 characters including spaces and punctuation.
 - i. **EXAMPLES:**
 1. **Acceptable: JONATHAN WILLIAM DOE (20 characters)**
 2. **In violation: JONATHAN "BUDDY" WILLIAM DOE (28 characters)**
4. A determination as to whether the candidate's requested name on the ballot complies with all of the rules discussed above is at the discretion of the Secretary of State or election superintendent, as appropriate.
5. The candidate name as it appears on the voter registration record can be checked by using the Secretary of State's "My Voter Page" tool at <https://www.mvp.sos.ga.gov/MVP/mvp.do>

Mandatory Training for Newly Elected County Commissioners

Georgia state law requires newly elected county commissioners to attend a minimum of 18 hours of training prior to assuming office in January. The objective of the training is to educate newly elected members of county governing authorities, *including consolidated governments*, about the powers, duties and responsibilities of their positions of public trust. *Further, a new state law which became effective on January 1, 2026, O.C.G.A. § 21-5-50 (a)(3.2)(A), requires all candidates qualifying for election to a county governing authority to acknowledge this training requirement as part of the qualification process.* The county training affidavit is available [here](#).

- (a) No elector shall be allowed to occupy a voting compartment or voting machine booth already occupied by another except when giving assistance as permitted by this chapter.
- (b) No elector shall remain in a voting compartment or voting machine booth an unreasonable length of time; and, if such elector shall refuse to leave after such period, he or she shall be removed by the poll officers.
- (c) No elector except a poll officer or poll watcher shall reenter the enclosed space after he or she has once left it except to give assistance as provided by this chapter.
- (d) No person, when within the polling place, shall electioneer or solicit votes for any political party or body or candidate or question, nor shall any written or printed matter be posted within the room, except as required by this chapter. The prohibitions contained within Code Section 21-2-414 shall be equally applicable within the polling place and no elector shall violate the provisions of Code Section 21-2-414.
- (e) No person shall use photographic or other electronic monitoring or recording devices, cameras, or cellular telephones while such person is in a polling place while voting is taking place; provided, however, that a poll manager, in his or her discretion, may allow the use of photographic devices in the polling place under such conditions and limitations as the election superintendent finds appropriate, and provided, further, that no photography shall be allowed of a ballot or the face of a voting machine or DRE unit or electronic ballot marker while an elector is voting such ballot or machine or DRE unit or using such electronic ballot marker, and no photography shall be allowed of an electors list, electronic electors list, or the use of an electors list or electronic electors list. This subsection shall not prohibit the use of photographic or other electronic monitoring or recording devices, cameras, or cellular telephones by poll officials for official purposes.
- (f) All persons except poll officers, poll watchers, persons in the course of voting and such persons' children under 18 years of age or any child who is 12 years of age or younger accompanying such persons, persons lawfully giving assistance to electors, duly authorized investigators of the State Election Board, and peace officers when necessary for the preservation of order, must remain outside the enclosed space during the progress of the voting. Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, any elector shall be permitted to be accompanied into the enclosed area and into a voting compartment or voting machine booth while voting by such elector's child or children under 18 years of age or any child who is 12 years of age or younger unless the poll manager or an assistant manager determines in his or her sole discretion that such child or children are causing a disturbance or are interfering with the conduct of voting. Children accompanying an elector in the enclosed space pursuant to this subsection shall not in any manner handle any ballot nor operate any function of the voting equipment under any circumstances.
- (g) When the hour for closing the polls shall arrive, all electors who have already qualified and are inside the enclosed space shall be permitted to vote; and, in addition thereto, all electors who are then in the polling place outside the

enclosed space, or then in line outside the polling place, waiting to vote, shall be permitted to do so if found qualified, but no other persons shall be permitted to vote.

(h) It shall be the duty of the chief manager to secure the observances of this Code section, to keep order in the polling place, and to see that no more persons are admitted within the enclosed space than are permitted by this chapter. Further, from the time a polling place is opened until the ballots are delivered to the superintendent, the ballots shall be in the custody of at least two poll officers at all times.

(i) No person except peace officers regularly employed by the federal, state, county, or municipal government or certified security guards shall be permitted to carry firearms within 150 feet of any polling place as provided for in subsection (b) of Code Section 16-11-127.

Editor's notes.

In light of the similarity of the statutory provisions, opinions under former Code 1933, § 34A-1212 and former Code Section 21-3-320 are included in the annotations for this Code section.

Scope of area and activity open to campaign worker during election. —

Except where there are no attempts at electioneering, it is legal for a candidate or a candidate's campaign worker to be present in a polling place, but outside an enclosed area during election or to be present outside a polling place, but within a 250-foot limit, but it is illegal to engage in noncommunicative but otherwise campaign related activity, specifically, observing voters and checking a voters list, outside a polling place but within the 250-foot limit. 1982 Op. Att'y Gen. No. 82-30 (decided prior to 1989 amendment to § 21-2-414(b) and under former Code 1933, § 34A-1212).



O.C.G.A. § 16-7-58



Current through the 2025 Regular Session of the General Assembly.

16-7-58. Prohibited placements of posters, signs, and advertisements.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person to place posters, signs, or advertisements:

(1) On any public property or building, unless the owner thereof or the occupier as authorized by such owner has given permission to place such posters, signs, or advertisements on such property; provided, however, that signs within the rights of way of public roads shall be governed by Code Section 32-6-51;

(2) On any private property unless the owner thereof or the occupier as authorized by such owner has given permission to place such posters, signs, or advertisements on such property; and, provided, further that no municipal, county, or consolidated government may restrict by regulation or other means the length of time a political campaign sign may be displayed or the number of signs which may be displayed on private property for which permission has been granted; or

(3) On any property zoned for commercial or industrial uses if the placement of such posters, signs, or advertisements conflicts with any zoning laws or ordinances.

(b) Any poster, sign, or advertisement placed in violation of paragraph (1) of subsection (a) of this Code section is declared to be a public nuisance, and the officials having jurisdiction of the public property or building, including without limitation law enforcement officers, may remove or direct the removal of the same.

(c) Each poster, sign, or advertisement placed in violation of this Code section shall constitute a separate offense.

(d) Any person who violates this Code section shall be punished the same as for littering under Code Section 16-7-43.

O.C.G.A. § 21-2-414

Current through the 2025 Regular Session of the General Assembly.

21-2-414. Restrictions on campaign activities, giving of food or water, and public opinion polling within the vicinity of a polling place; cellular phone use prohibited; prohibition of candidates from entering certain polling places.

(a) No person shall solicit votes in any manner or by any means or method, nor shall any person distribute or display any campaign material, nor shall any person give, offer to give, or participate in the giving of any money or gifts, including, but not limited to, food and drink, to an elector, nor shall any person solicit signatures for any petition, nor shall any person, other than election officials discharging their duties, establish or set up any tables or booths on any day in which ballots are being cast:

- (1) Within 150 feet of the outer edge of any building within which a polling place is established;
- (2) Within any polling place; or
- (3) Within 25 feet of any voter standing in line to vote at any polling place.

These restrictions shall not apply to conduct occurring in private offices or areas which cannot be seen or heard by such electors.

(b) Rooms under the control or supervision of the board of registrars or absentee ballot clerk in which absentee ballots are being cast shall be considered polling places.

(c)

(1) No person shall conduct any exit poll or public opinion poll with voters within 25 feet of the exit of any building in which a polling place is established on any day in which ballots are being cast.

(2) Except for credentialed poll watchers, poll workers, and law enforcement officers, poll managers may manage the number of persons allowed in the polling place to prevent confusion, congestion, and inconvenience to voters.

(d) No person whose name appears as a candidate on the ballot being voted upon at a primary, election, special primary, or special election shall physically enter any polling place other than the polling place at which that person is authorized to cast his or her ballot for that primary, election, special primary, or special election and, after casting his or her ballot, the candidate shall not return to such polling place until after the poll has closed and voting has ceased or other than to transact business with the board of registrars, so long as the person does not violate any other provision of this Code section.

(e) This Code section shall not be construed to prohibit a poll officer from distributing materials, as required by law, which are necessary for the purpose of instructing electors or from distributing materials prepared by the Secretary of State which are designed solely for the purpose of encouraging voter participation in the election being conducted or from making available self-service water from an unattended receptacle to an elector waiting in line to vote.

(f) Any person who violates this Code section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.


1. Maintain a separate segregated bank account, and
 2. Register and file in the same manner as campaign committees before accepting or making any contributions or expenditures, pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 21-5-34(e.1).
- Under this new statutory framework, the former \$25,000 threshold—which previously triggered PAC registration and reporting requirements under § 21-5-34(e)—no longer applies. After reviewing staff-proposed rules addressing potential conflicts between § 21-5-34(e) and the newly adopted § 21-5-34(e.1), the Commission determined that no additional rulemaking was necessary. Because § 21-5-34(e.1) is a separate provision that explicitly governs Political Action Committees, its requirements apply independently and do not include the prior threshold exceptions.

Starting **January 1, 2026**, PACs must register and report in the same manner as campaign committees prior to making or receiving any contributions or expenditures, with no monetary threshold. Additionally, registration will no longer be annual as the PAC will have continued disclosure statement reporting until termination of the PAC.

Due to changes in SB199, specifically O.C.G.A. § 21-5-34(e.1), the Commission advises that all contributions to and all expenditures from a PAC bank account must be reported on PAC disclosure reports. To the extent that expenditures from the PAC bank account do not fall within the definition of O.C.G.A. § 21-5-3(12), such as administrative costs or expenditures made to out-of-state candidates for office, the Commission advises that these expenditures must still be accounted for and reported in order for the PAC to report its on-hand balance pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 21-5-34(b) or otherwise zero out and terminate pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 21-5-34(e.1). A PAC may report this category of expenditures that does not fall within the statutory definition of O.C.G.A. § 21-5-3(12) by either itemizing each expenditure on the PAC disclosure report or reporting the aggregated total of all such expenditures as a single, non-itemized entry on the disclosure report.

1. **DOI** – Declaration of Intention to Accept Campaign Contributions.
2. **CCDR** – Campaign Contribution Disclosure Report (This also includes the Final Report and Termination Statement).
3. **Affidavit of Exemption** – Affidavit of a Candidate's Intent Not to Exceed 2,500 in Contributions and/or Expenditures.
4. **TBDR** – Two Business Day Report.
5. **PFDS** – Personal Financial Disclosure Statement.

DOI

• Anyone who is not already a public officer and who plans to run for public office must file a Declaration of Intention to Accept Campaign Contributions before accepting or spending campaign contributions—Ga. Comp. R. & Regs. R. 188-6-.10.

• **Filing the Form DOI triggers the reporting requirement for filers to file campaign contribution disclosure reports.**

• As soon as the Form DOI is filed with the Local Filing Officers, filers are required to start reporting their contributions and/or expenditures following the filing schedule.

• There is no expiration date for the Form DOI. The Form DOI is valid until the candidate and/or public official disposes of all campaign funds and terminates the account—O.C.G.A. § 22-5-93, 21-5-34(m).

CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTION DISCLOSURE REPORTS

- The CCDR is filed directly with the local filing officer.
- If the county or municipality offers a way for filers to file electronically, that is permitted. If that option is not available, all filers will file the CCDR form manually.
- The CCDR form must be filed in its entirety. That means a filer must file all ten pages regardless of whether or not the information is on the page.
- There is a **five-day grace period** for all CCDR filings.
- Runoff elections have a grace period of only two days.

AFFIDAVIT OF EXEMPTION

- This is a document candidates and/or public officials can file if they **DO NOT** intend on accepting a combined total of \$2,500 in contributions and/or expenditures during an election cycle.
- The affidavit allows a filer to be "exempt" from filing campaign contribution disclosure reports if they remain under the aggregate (combined) threshold of \$2,500.
- The affidavit is filed directly with the local filing officer.
- **The affidavit does not apply to the Personal Financial Disclosure Statement (PFDS). All elected officials and candidates must file PFDS, regardless of whether they have an affidavit on file.**
- The affidavit is only valid for one election cycle.
 - What is an election cycle? An election cycle is the day after the November General Election to the next November General Election when that person will be on the ballot for the same race—Reference O.C.G.A. § 21-5-3(10).
 - A new affidavit must be filed for every election cycle.

TWO BUSINESS DAY REPORT

- This report is used to report contributions received, including loans, of a \$1,000 or more. This report is only filed during certain times of the year.
- This report is due during the time period between when the last CCDR is due before an election and the election date for which a candidate has qualified.
- This report is not filed every time a filer receives \$1,000 or more. The contributions **MUST** be reported within two business days of receipt and **MUST** be reported on the next scheduled CCDR.
- There is **NO** grace period for the two business day report—Reference O.C.G.A. § 21-5-34(c)(2)(C). If the filer has an affidavit of exemption on file, they are not required to file this report unless the threshold is crossed.

Personal Financial Disclosure Statement

- When are PFDS due?
- April 1st each year for county officials
 - September 1st year year for all municipal officials There is no grace period for the PFDS
- The PFDS is a document filed by each public official and each person who qualifies as a candidate for election as a public officer as defined in subparagraphs (F) and (G) of O.C.G.A. § 21-5-3 that discloses information about financial activity for the preceding calendar year.

FINAL REPORT AND TERMINATION STATEMENT

- This is the final report filers must file to terminate their campaigns.
- This report can only be filed when the filer has a net balance on hand of \$0 and has \$0 in campaign debt. All filers file this report to terminate their campaign.
- If a filer has an affidavit of exemption on file, they will still file this report when it is time to terminate. The final report and termination statement is filed directly with the local filing officer.


